



Adamson Tours Canada with Feist

In a recent Canadian tour, Adamson Systems partnered with Clair Canada to provide sound reinforcement for venues between 4,000 and 8,000. The main system featured 16 Adamson Y10 flown on each side, with two Spektrix per side as under-hang, and lastly 6 SX Subs stacked per side. Front fills included 6 Clair P2 loudspeakers, while side hangs included 10 Spektrix per side. Lab.gruppen 3400, 6400, and 10000Q power amplifiers were used, with Dolby Lake processing. Touring personnel included Brennan McGuire, System Tech Jon Halliwell, and Monitor Engineer Tyler Scollon. McGuire used a Digidesign Profile 48-channel digital mixing console, while Scollon used a Yamaha PM5D-RH mixing console, with 12 Clair SRM monitor wedges.

EAW Installed at Christian Center

London, England's Ealing Christian Center (ECC) has upgraded its sound reinforcement system, using EAW SM Series stage monitors for both vocalists and musicians. The center, based in West London, is situated in a former theater, with a congregation of 1,200 people. Having already installed an EAW KF600 Series compact three-way VAT System, both ground-stacked and flown, the system is now complete with the addition of the monitors. AA Systems, a UK EAW dealer, completed the system upgrade. "Sam Blake, ECC's Music and Worship Director, contacted me in November regarding upgrading the monitor system," stated Adrian Copestake of AA systems. "After learning that KF650z compact array loudspeakers and SB600z subwoofers were already installed, we soon agreed that the SM range of monitors would fit the bill nicely. The system consists of four SM64's and four SM15's – two left and two right. The SM64's will be used for the choir and the SM15's for the musicians. Together, combined with the amps and processors, this now provides the Centre with eight EAW monitor mixes."
